Good afternoon Leonette,

I have completed my preliminary review of the October 21, 2019 application and plan submittal for the above referenced case. The applicant is requesting the review and design approval of plans for the renovation, and exterior expansion (outdoor dining) of an existing building located at 5180 Northfield Road. The property is located in the Neighborhood Commercial (NC) Zoning District and the plan set that was submitted consists of the architectural drawings and a preliminary site layout.


The site layout lacks sufficient detail to review the off street parking provided but it is noted that the construction of the outdoor dining area will eliminate four (4) parking spaces that currently serve the existing facility. I have included an aerial photo of the site on page 2.

1290.06 (V) SCHEDULE OF REQUIRED OFF-STREET PARKING requires 1 space per 50 square feet of floor area, or 1 space for each 2 seats, whichever requires the greater number of spaces for restaurants bars and taverns. The plans indicate the square footage of the seating area in the building is 900 square feet and the outside seating area has another 392 square feet for a total of 1292 square feet which requires 26 parking spaces. The architectural plan shows 36 seats inside and 24 seats outside for a total of 60 seats which requires 30 parking spaces. The site plan does not show parking for but it appears very unlikely that more than 9 vehicles could be accommodated on site.

Based on my review of the submitted documents I would recommend that the Commissioners seek additional information on the proposed off street parking that will be provided before granting preliminary approval for the proposed site plan.

Final Engineering approval will be contingent upon the granting of any required variances and the submission and approval of detailed site construction plans for the development. The site construction plans, primarily for parking, will be required to include boundary, grading and drainage plans, and all pertinent details prior to the issuance of construction permits. The applicant should also be made aware that under the City's current operations and maintenance agreement with the Cuyahoga County Department of Public Works, all stormwater and sanitary sewer improvements, including grease traps, must also be reviewed and approved by the Department of Public Works. My office will review pollution prevention plans. I will commence the review of the site construction plans once they have been submitted to my office. It is the applicant's responsibility to coordinate the Department of Public Works review and approval. The City cannot issue construction permits until all County approvals have been issued.
